A Message from Benson's Athletic Director Scott Archer

Athletic Registration now online!

We are excited to announce that we are now offering the convenience of online athletic registration through FamilyID (<u>www.familyid.com</u>).

Benson Athletics will have a live link to share next week.

For now, please note that the athletic clearance process will move online, where it will be housed at FamilyID.com. For those already cleared, please have your student stop by the athletic office to express interest in a spring sport. If athletics is unaware of your student's interest in a spring sport, we won't have them cleared even if they played a fall or winter sport. Your student must come in to be added to the spring sports clearance list.

At FamilyID, you will upload your student's physical, pay athletic fees, designate which sports your student is playing, and learn about the academic requirements to be OSAA, and PIL eligible for participation.

FamilyID is a secure registration platform that provides you with an easy, user-friendly way to register for our programs, and helps us to be more administratively efficient and environmentally responsible.

When you register through FamilyID, the system keeps track of your information in your FamilyID profile. You enter your information only once for each family member for multiple uses and multiple programs.

Once we go live this week, the following must be completed: **INFORMATION NEEDED TO REGISTER:**

It will be helpful to have the following information handy to allow for accurate completion of your online registration.

Doctor information, Health Insurance Information, Student ID, payment method

REGISTRATION PROCESS:

Follow these steps:

- To find your program, click on the link provided (coming soon!), and select the registration form under the word *Programs*.
- Next click on the green *Register Now* button and scroll, if necessary, to the *Create Account/Log In* green buttons. If this is your first time using FamilyID, click *Create Account*. Click *Log In*, if you already have a FamilyID account.
- *Create* your secure FamilyID account by entering the account owner First and Last names (parent/guardian), E-mail address and password. Select *I Agree* to the FamilyID Terms of Service. Click *Create Account*.
- You will receive an email with a link to activate your new account. (If you don't see the email, check your E -mail filters (spam, junk, etc.).

Click on the link in your activation E-mail, which will log you in to FamilyID.com

- Once in the registration form, complete the information requested. All fields with a red* are required to have an answer.
- Click the Continue button when your form is complete.

Review your registration summary.

We will have a live link next week.

Tips for Benson's College-Bounders

<u>Meet with your high school counselor</u>: Your guidance and college counselors will have the resources and guidelines that can make the whole college application process a lot easier.

<u>Review your transcript</u>: Semester grades will be posted soon. Check transcript carefully for errors. If you happen to find a mistake, politely bring it the attention of your counselor.

<u>Go to college presentations</u>: Don't miss opportunities to meet with college reps on visiting our campus. This is an excellent way to learn more about the schools and to ask questions you may have.

<u>Make a list of application deadlines and supporting materials needed</u>: Read through all your applications thoroughly to find out what supporting materials they require and what their deadlines are. Post the list somewhere and/or add set notifications on your electronic device, so you remember what needs to be done.

<u>Ask for teacher recommendations</u>: If you are applying to a private college, chances are when you checked the application for other materials you need, you discovered that you would need at least one recommendation from a teacher or community member. *Be sure to ask your recommender well in advance and give them everything they ask for.*

<u>Get started on applications</u>: Create an account for the school you will be applying. Make sure you write down your username and password somewhere you won't lose it. Make a point of setting aside time every week to start filling out the general information asked for on the applications.

Begin thinking about your essays If the application requires an essay: When applicable, look over prompts and begin jotting down ideas for the essays.

<u>Complete the FAFSA/ORSAA</u>: Sign up for FAFSA PIN If you plan to apply for financial aid. You will need your completed 2016 tax documents.

<u>Sign up for the NCAA Clearinghouse, if you are a student athlete:</u> You must sign up for the NCAA Clearinghouse and send them your SAT or ACT scores if you plan on playing collegiate sports at a Division I or Division II institution.

ASK QUESTIONS! When in doubt, visit the counseling center and get help. Waiting until the last minute can make the process overwhelming.
