A Message from the BHS Attendance Office

We encourage students to attend on a regular basis. Studies show that missing more than one day per month can actually lead to poorer grades and contributes to dropping out of school.

Naturally, we understand that there are occasions that a student must miss a school day. When this happens it is important for you to contact the school to let us know the reason for the absence. Please remember to communicate directly with the attendance office if your student will be absent for any period of time during the school day. The best ways to let us know are, in order of school preference:

Send an email to the attendance office at benson-attendance@pps.net
Call the attendance line directly at 503-916-5109
Call the school main office number at 503-916-5100 - Select option 3
Send a note via your student excusing the absence

Always remember, we need the STUDENT NAME, ID# (if known) and REASON FOR THE ABSENCE. (Saying it is an excused absence does not give us the reason, please be specific) The Attendance Office will check messages and emails at 7:30am and throughout the school day. The attendance phone line is continuously busy throughout the school day. An email provides a written message directly to the attendance office. The attendance office can excuse previous absences up to three days after the absence occurs. After the three days, corrections cannot be made.

You can monitor your child's attendance through ParentVUE. Contact the school if you do not know how to access ParentVUE.

If you do not communicate with the school, we cannot properly record your child's absence. If you have any questions regarding your child's attendance do not hesitate to email or call the attendance office. Please help us, help your student have a successful year here at Benson Tech.

This small group will be facilitated by Benson's Youth Transition Program coordinator, Mrs. Kia Swain and supported by Benson's career coordinator, Mrs. Miranda Ryan. We will work together to provide your student information to develop their post-secondary plans. As well as, locate employment, internship, volunteer or other career based opportunities

Purpose: To support Junior and Senior students to identify your skills/strengths, support you to identify specific, achievable career goals and then design and implement strategies to reach your goals. Also, we will discuss self-advocacy in the area of disability disclosure and accommodations with workplace employers or school staff.

When: Every other Monday, 1-2:15 pm (asynchronous time) First session: Monday, October 12th, 2020. Then, 10/26, 11/9, 11/23, 12/7, 12/14 (special session before Winter break).

Fall Outdoor School Updates

This Fall we will be able to offer a two college credit course from PCC this fall for students who would like to register and attend this online ED 208 Outdoor School Leadership course. This class will meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30pm-5pm starting in late September and ending in December. PCC is offering this course for only \$25 per student, but we are hoping to get funding to make the course free or at least provide funds for those who can not afford the \$25 fee.

We would like to open the online registration very soon for those high school leaders who want to stay involved with our program and for those who are new and want to learn more about Outdoor School. We hope to keep them engaged with our program and give them new opportunities to be involved virtually in hopes that they would be able to participate in person when we are able to have students back at the ODS sites.

This year there will not be a traditional workshop and everything is online. Student's parents' would be getting an approval email as soon as the student registers.
