A Message from Rene Mitchell Regarding Opportunities for Black Youth

As you may have heard, I Am MORE has started a campaign designed to spread Black JOY - http://www.SpreadingBlackJoy.com!! We have SEVERAL youth-focused contests and would love your help spreading the word to any Black youth you know.

If you know of poets, we are extending the deadline for our poetry contest to **Jan. 25.** *Please see attached poster.* One of the poets will also get a chance to deliver their poem at the annual All Hands Raised Gala in February and earn \$250.

We are also challenging youth to create a short TikTok or YouTube video to a song on the website about creating space for Black Joy - https://www.spreadingblackjoy.com/ youthcreativity

Our Resiliency in Rhythm youth showcase - as part of the annual Fertile Ground festival - will be featured on **Jan. 30, 7 p.m.** Our show is featuring three of the Black youth who have been organizing Black Lives Matter protests, a poet, a rapper, and other talented youth. Streaming will be on FB and YouTube. Learn more at http://fertilegroundpdx.org/

We are also organizing more Talk Back/Talk Black online conversations with youth, in partnership with Multnomah County and Children's Community Clinic. We will be training youth to be paid to facilitate the conversations with various groups, including rural youth, foster care, biracial, African immigrants, etc.

We are also starting a new youth-voice project called "See Me. I Am. HEAR." This is a youth storytelling empowerment project that is a mix between TEDTalk and Oprah's Master Class. We will be training youth on how to write the WHY of their personal stories, connecting them with a professional speaking coach, videotaping parts of their life story, and teaching them how to create a money-making branding opportunity with their message, while creating space on community television for Black youth to change the narrative of what our young people's possibilities can be in the world - and the wisdom they already have to inspire and empower others. We are excited about this and hope you have Black youth who see this as a moment to shine.

We also are helping Black students interested in attending an HBCU with an opportunity to get access to scholarships, through a friend of mine at Salesforce who helped start HBCUforce, a nonprofit organization that partners with Historically Black Colleges and Universities to implement programs for Black students to pursue cloud computing careers. *Let me know if any of your students are interested in learning more.*

Lastly, we are partnering with Bodecker Foundation to encourage youth to sign up for FREE online workshops for Portland-area high school students. Led by professional artists, writers, musicians, designers and educators, the multidisciplinary creative workshops meet via Zoom on weekdays from 4-5:30 pm. Workshops include a mix of online group activities and offline individual and/or collaborative project work. Winter Term begins February 1, 2021. Online registration is now open. Class size is generally limited to 12 students. So, MAKE SURE you tell your youth to mention I Am MORE on the registration form so they get priority signup on the classes. AVID is an elective option for next year's sophomores and juniors. AVID is for motivated students who are underrepresented at 4-year universities and want support to achieve their dream of going to college. Students stay with AVID for three years, and it helps prepare them for challenging high school courses such as honors, dual credit and Advanced Placement, which open doors to college. Students benefit from field trips to colleges, learning study skills, and college research. During junior and senior year, students prepare college, scholarship, and financial aid applications with the support of the AVID teacher. AVID is a supportive environment with a family vibe.

Mindstream also offers a host of engaging content and programming for students, all free due to generous sponsors such as Microsoft, Boeing, Bonneville Power, Multnomah Co, T-Mobile, ATT, Nike & many others.

Plug into Portland program, are providing **free** desktop computers to K-12 students who meet their eligibility requirements. Plug into Portland are also prioritizing **houseless students**, **students with accessibility needs**, **and low-income students**. Here is the application to fill out in order to **apply for a computer**: <u>Plug into Portland application</u>.

An adult and/or not a K-12 student and they're in need of a computer, we might be able to grant them a desktop computer through our Adoption program. Previously individuals (16 and older) could volunteer at Free Geek for 24 hours and earn a computer, but since COVID-19, Free Geek has been closed for volunteering so instead we've changed our eligibility criteria to prioritize low-income individuals, houseless individuals, and individuals with accessibility needs. Fill out our Gift a Geek Box application in order to apply for a computer through our adoption program.

Bear in mind that these programs are seeing wait times of up to eight weeks due to the high volume of applications.

A Message from the BHS Attendance Office

We encourage students to attend on a regular basis. Studies show that missing more than one day per month can actually lead to poorer grades and contributes to dropping out of school.

Naturally, we understand that there are occasions that a student must miss a school day. When this happens it is important for you to contact the school to let us know the reason for the absence. Please remember to communicate directly with the attendance office if your student will be absent for any period of time during the school day. The best ways to let us know are, in order of school preference:

Send an email to the attendance office at benson-attendance@pps.net
Call the attendance line directly at 503-916-5109
Call the school main office number at 503-916-5100 - Select option 3
Send a note via your student excusing the absence

Always remember, we need the STUDENT NAME, ID# (if known) and REASON FOR THE ABSENCE. (Saying it is an excused absence does not give us the reason, please be specific) The Attendance Office will check messages and emails at 7:30am and throughout the school day. The attendance phone line is continuously busy throughout the school day. An email provides a written message directly to the attendance office. The attendance office can excuse previous absences up to three days after the absence occurs. After the three days, corrections cannot be made.

You can monitor your child's attendance through ParentVUE. Contact the school if you do not know how to access ParentVUE.

A Message from the BHS Attendance Office

If you do not communicate with the school, we cannot properly record your child's absence. If you have any questions regarding your child's attendance do not hesitate to email or call the attendance office. Please help us, help your student have a successful year here at Benson Tech.

With the advent of distance learning, there are some questions that have arisen. I am finding that the majority of questions regarding attendance are addressing asynchronous classes. The following is an explanation of how this and other attendance calls could be avoided.

Asynchronous days are not live sessions with the instructor. There are various ways your student can contact the teacher for attendance purposes.

They log on and just check in with the teacher.

They contact the teacher by emailing if they have any questions or need assistance with the assignment.

They complete the posted assignment and turn it in. The assignment cannot be turned in late to count toward attendance. While they may receive credit for turning it in late they would still be counted as absent if they don't contact the teacher in another way.

Their parent may email the attendance email at benson-attendance@pps.net to leave a valid reason for the absence (illness, appointment, etc.)

If you get a call saying your student has missed a period, I would correspond with the classroom teacher directly. I will always need authorization from the classroom teacher to correct an absence. By contacting the teacher directly, they can send me an email for a quick correction. This is also important because the State of Oregon mandates that I may not make corrections to attendance more than three school days prior to the current school date.
