Attention All Benson Students,

Do you plan on attending PIL League games when Benson is playing at other PIL league schools? Do you want to make the vaccination card check station easier for yourself?

PPS and the PIL have developed a program to make going to PIL league games across the district easier for you. Here is how you do that:

- --Bring your vaccination card AND your Student ID to Mr. Clark in Room A-32
- --After showing him this he will give you a PIL sticker that you put on the back of your ID card

If you have this sticker and you show your ID card and this sticker at other PIL schools you will be able to get in as quickly as you do at Benson home games.

Without this sticker you have to show your ID and vaccination card/proof of a negative test within 72 of the event you are attending.

This sticker will only work for away games at Cleveland, Franklin, McDaniel, Grant, Lincoln, Wells, Jefferson, and Roosevelt

Spectators That Are Not PPS Students

For all PIL/PPS Events you are required to provide the following when you arrive:

-- Proof of Vaccination (12 and Up)

OR

- -- Proof of Negative COVID Test within 72 hours of the attending (12 and Up)
- --A ID that matches with the name on the vaccination card/negative test
- -- Masks are required at all times unless actively eating or drinking

A Message from Nutrition Services

New for the 2021-22 School Year

All PPS students eat breakfast and lunch for FREE. Students will receive 1 breakfast and 1 lunch per day. Menu information, along with allergy and carbohydrate counts can be found at www.pps.net/nutrition

Benson is a CEP school for the 2021-22 school year and we are not allowed to process lunch applications for CEP sites because all students enrolled at CEP sites automatically qualify for free meals and are eligible for a letter they can use for discounts such as sports fee waivers, bus passes, etc without an application. If a family has students at other schools that are NOT CEP or if your student transfers to a NON-CEP school you can apply here: https://www.schoolcafe.com/pps, if you want a copy of a letter for your Benson students you can request one here: mealbenefits@pps.net.
