Benson Tech Earthquake Drill

Hello Benson Polytechnic Families,

Benson Tech will hold an Earthquake drill on Wednesday 04/20/2022.

The earthquake drill is designed to help all staff and students know what to do in the case of an actual earthquake.

Benson Building students and staff will Drop, Cover, and Hold-on for 2 minute. By practicing the drill and sharing information with students, we are complying with Oregon legislative requirements mandating Oregon schools participate in earthquake drills every year.

We invite families to follow the guidance included in this email to discuss the information and practice with your families at home.

I have included a "Creating a Family Plan" activity that you can complete with your family members.

Creating a Family Plan

Have you created a <u>family plan</u>? (note: we have these plans translated in <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Japanese</u>, <u>Chinese</u>, <u>Vietnamese</u>, <u>Somali</u>, and <u>Russian</u>).

Remember, discussions should also be talking in an age appropriate way with students about the school's, or a family emergency response plan. Please remember to <u>Grounding Technique Practice in Trauma-Informed Emergency</u>

Drills when discussing or practicing an emergency drill.

PREPARING FOR APRIL'S MANDATORY DRILL "DUCK, COVER, HOLD ON"

When the ground begins to shake, everyone must duck, cover, and hold on.

If indoors, staff and students get under their desk or table, wrap one arm around the table or chair leg and clasp one hand behind their head covering their neck as well.

If you are unable to get under a desk, it is important to stand next to an inside wall and get away from any windows or heavy objects which may fall on or near where you are standing.

Drop to your knees with your back to windows, clasp one hand behind your head covering your neck, bury your face and use your arms to protect your head, close your eyes and hold on until the shaking stops.

If you are outside, move away from falling hazards like poles and trees.

Once the shaking stops, check yourself for injury first and then check students.

Do not automatically rush students outside. Maintain situational awareness and use *option based decision making* to assess the situation and potentially evacuate.

Take rosters, emergency supplies, and personal belongings if they can be reached safely.

Please keep in mind that following an emergency event like an earthquake that electricity, gas, water, and phones may not work.

Assemble at your designated evacuation location and take attendance. Use the green "All Clear" card for students who are all accounted for or the red card to identify that there are missing students and you require assistance.

Staff should be prepared to stay with students until the reunification process has begun.
